Dancing at a distance

a letter from our president

A pandemic didn't stop the Ceili of the Valley Society from continuing its mission.

Our group got off to a great start in 2020 with our Annual Board Retreat where we set goals for the year and also continued regular classes, monthly ceilis, and planned performances and activities.

The Seven Celtic Nations exhibit, which was set up at the end of 2019 at the Salem Multicultural Center and World Beat, continued into the New Year. In fact, the Center requested that it remain up a month longer than originally scheduled. As part of the exhibit the Multicultural Center asked Ceili volunteers to be available as experts for scheduled tours. Two groups from Willamette University requested that in 2020. Being able to participate in their educational experience added to our mission to promote Celtic Culture.

We believe that Ceili of the Valley Society may have had the only St. Patrick's Day parade in the United States in 2020. With the coronavirus spreading, St. Patrick's events scheduled in March were canceled as governments requested lockdowns. Our group's event happened just before restrictions. With a piper leading the way we marched using social distance guidelines through Riverfront Park and parts of Salem. The coronavirus did not deter the joy of the day. In a regular year various groups ask Ceili of the Valley Society to do dance demonstrations, especially around St. Patrick's Day. Our group was able to complete only two before restrictions caused a cascade of cancellations. Community events where Ceili of the Valley Society performed and encouraged audience participation did not happen. It was a very different year. The temporary tattoos we ordered to give to visitors at our exhibit booths wait for another year.

However, the coronavirus did not stop Ceili of the Valley Society from continuing to retain our community presence. As it became clear that an inperson Samhain Celtic New Year Festival would not be possible, our Board decided to explore a virtual festival. With the assistance of contacts in the Celtic community, multiple Celtic groups came forward to participate in the music portion of the month-long Festival, supplying music videos, their biographies and contact information. The Festival had virtual representations from all of the Seven Celtic Nations in its cultural section, highlighting foods and recipes, dance, language, and activities. There were virtual demonstrations and vendors. Particular highlights were four live zoom events, a concert from Scotland with Jim and Susie Malcolm, a sean-nos dance class and demonstration by Maldon Meehan, a history of the women in the Irish Rebellion by Aislinn Adams, and a virtual whisky tasting hosted by Bill Mullen. The four live presentations were well-attended and well-received. Based on statistics from computer data, the Festival was a success. We are hoping to return to a live event in 2021 and have reserved the Willamette Heritage Center for October 24th.

Finally, in-person classes and Ceilis have been on hiatus since March 2020. That has not stopped the group! With Zoom's help, classes continue. And, we tried a couple zoom Ceilis before pausing for the holiday season. Our caller, Elisa Chandler has even adjusted some dances to adhere to social distancing guidelines once we are able to dance in person.

All in all, despite a pandemic, Ceili of the Valley Society proved that it is integral in promoting Irish and Celtic culture in the Mid-Willamette Valley.

Before closing, I would like to give a huge thank you to Elisa Chandler. She has tirelessly devoted her time to becoming a zoom expert to help pivot our dancing to a virtual format. Without her, our Virtual Samhain Celtic New Year Festival would not have proceeded as smoothly. On behalf of the Festival Committee, she downloaded all musician videos, set up and did sound checks for all live demonstrations and, as treasurer, sent compensation to appropriate participants. She is integral to Ceili of the Valley Society's success.

We look forward to 2021, a year we hope brings a close to the pandemic; a year we can once again return to in-person activities.

celtic music hour

The show must go on! Despite having the radio station closed to DJ's since mid-March due to the pandemic, the Celtic Music Hour has not missed a beat. Because we've been on the air since December of 2011, we have a large number of saved recorded shows. Who knew we'd be drawing upon them now? Before this year, we'd only had one replay in the entire duration of the show.

We started the year 2020 with our traditional Rockin' in the New Year show. And we had our first interview of the year with Seamus Egan in February in anticipation of his concert at the Smith Fine Arts series on March 14th. Unfortunately, Smith Fine Arts had to cancel that performance.

We are fortunate that we have such a great group of listeners. They have appreciated the shows, which have been edited to include more music and eliminate past Celtic Calendars. We've also been able to add some updated Celtic activities, such as Ceili of the Valley Society's Virtual Samhain Celtic New Year Festival.

And, we've improvised. Having both DJ's creating the show has been our hallmark. Due to social distancing, that cannot happen. Ann has been granted access to the station as an essential worker. She cleans the space. So, we have done one completely new show with a New Music theme. On one of her cleaning days, Ann took extra time to be the lead DJ, while Beth called in to add her comments. This recorded show aired for our annual Show of Gratitude in November. Plus, we expanded our genre. We interviewed a Celtic author! Through the magic of Zoom, we interviewed Eilidh Miller prior to the release of her inaugural book, *The Watchers*. Since the book involved Scottish history, we aired her interview on our show honoring St. Andrew's Day.

Despite challenges in the year, the Celtic Music Hour has adapted to continue to entertain and educate our listeners. Stay tuned for more in 2021.

The downside to a virtual Ceili dance class is teaching new dancers, so it's primarily experienced dancers attending, which is fun for all of us, but I would like to figure out how to reach new folks. I guess that can be a New Year's Resolution for me!

Mostly, I want to say thank you to everyone that has stayed connected via the ceilis, classes, renewed memberships, Facebook, Messenger...Our Ceili of the Valley Dance Family is still strong and we all look forward to a brighter 2021.




